- Capping Medicare out-of-pocket costs for prescription drugs at \$2,000 (introduced by Representatives Nancy Pelosi and Frank Pollone);
- Creating routine hearing, vision, and dental benefits under Medicare (introduced by Representative Lloyd Doggett);
- Protecting Medicare and Medicaid form benefit cuts by making if difficult in the Senate to increase the Medicare legal age, privatize Medicare, reduce Medicaid funding through block grants or per capita caps, or eliminate the ACA Medicaid expansion through budget reconciliation legislation (introduced by Senator Mazie Hirono);
- Covering hearing exams and hearing aids (introduced by Representative Debbie Dingell, HR 1518).

Whereas: Many people on Medicare live with health problems including multiple chronic conditions and limitations in their activities of daily living, and many beneficiaries live on modest incomes. In 2016, nearly one third (32%) had a functional impairment, one quarter (25%) reported being in fair or poor health, and more than one in five (22%) had five or more chronic conditions. More than one in seven beneficiaries (15%) were under age 65 and living with a long-term disability, and 12 percent were ages 85 and over. Nearly two million beneficiaries (3%) lived in a long-term care facility. In 2016, half of all people on Medicare had incomes below \$26,200 per person and savings below \$74,350.
