This report highlights the Events convened since the last Annual Meeting of June 5, 2022 to the present 2023 Annual Meeting. We will also give an overview of the remaining 2023 Events yet to come. June 5, 2022 kicked off our 2022-2023 Events with the Senior Caucus Annual Meeting. The zoom meeting was led by Caucus Chair Kay Hendrikson. Lawrence Sandoval performed the duties of Parliamentarian, and Bill Middlecamp expertly handled the Communications. All Caucus Officers and Committees presented annual reports, Charter revisions were voted, and Special Speakers addressed the Annual Meeting.
